MRI Information for Patients

What is magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)?

MRI is a means of “seeing” inside of the body in order for doctors to find certain diseases or abnormal conditions. MRI does not rely on the type of radiation used for an x-ray or CT.

Is MRI safe?

To date, over 400 million patients have had MRI’s. MRI has been shown to be extremely safe as long as proper safety precautions are taken. In general, the MRI procedure produces no pain and causes no known short-term or long-term tissue damage of any kind.

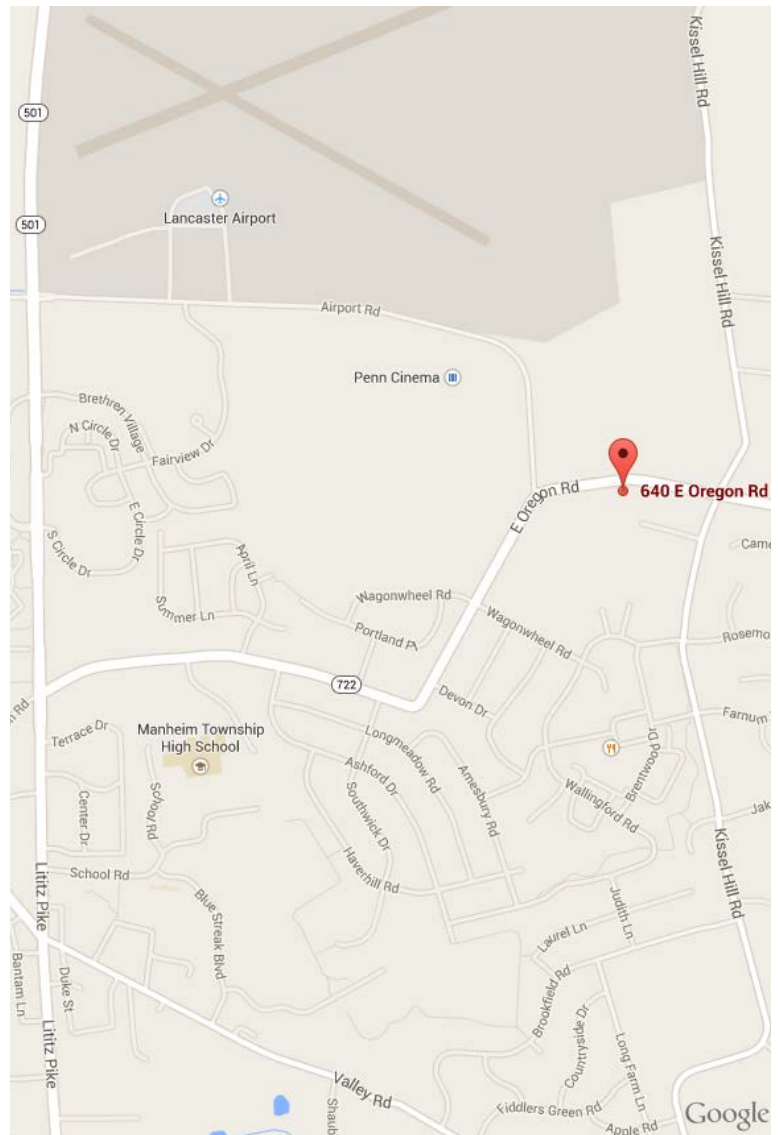
How to prepare for the MRI examination.

There’s no special preparation necessary for the MRI. There are no food or drink restrictions. Continue to take any medication prescribed by your doctor unless otherwise directed.

You won’t be allowed to wear anything metallic during the MRI, so it would be best to leave watches, jewelry or anything made of metal at home. Even some cosmetics contain small amounts of metal so it is best not to wear make-up. You may be asked to change into a gown prior to entering the MRI scan room.

What is the MRI like?

The MRI is very loud and you will be required to use earplugs or headphones. You will lie down on your back and depending on what body part that is being imaged you may have a contraption laid around the area of interest. The most important thing is to relax and remain still during the procedure.
